COUNTY, GREETINGS:

BY THE AUTHORITY OF THE STATE OF CONNECTICUT, You are hereby
commanded to summon the CITY OF DANBURY, County of Fairfield,
State of Connecticut, to appear before the Superior Court, for
the judicial district of Danbury, at Danbury, on the Fifth
Tuesday of Sept. 1980, said appearance to be made by said City
of Danbury, or its attorney, by filing a written statement of
appearance with the clerk of the court on or before the second
day following said return date, then and there to answer to
CHRYSLER CORPORATION, a Delaware Corporation doing business in
the State of Connecticut, in a civil action wherein the Third
Party Plaintiff complains and says:

1. From the date of its purchase on or about July, 1975,
and at all times subsequent thereto up to and including the
death of plaintiff's decedent Steven Michalko on November 11,
1976, the City of Danbury, owned, serviced, repaired, and main-
tained the 1975 Plymouth Valiant automobile in which said Steven
Michalko, as alleged in Patricia Michalko's complaint, died.

2. The City of Danbury provided said 1975 Plymouth Valiant
to Steven Michalko on the date of his death, and on various
occasions prior thereto, for use in connection with his employ-
ment as a regular member of the Danbury Police Department.

3. The City of Danbury, its agents and employees, negligent-
ly and carelessly maintained, serviced, or repaired said
automobile in one or more of the following ways:

- (a) it improperly selected and installed a replacement muffler for said automobile;
- (b) it failed to promptly and properly repair body damage to the left rear (exhaust exit) side of the automobile caused by a rear end collision, which damage compromised the integrity of the trunk and passenger compartment;
- (c) it failed to provide skilled mechanics properly qualified and trained to perform routine maintenance and repair of said automobile;
- (d) it failed to take other steps necessary to prevent penetration of carbon monoxide fumes through the damage and/or alteration into the passenger compartment of said automobile.

4. Although it know or should have known that, by reason of said negligent maintenance, service, and repair of said automobile, said automobile was in a defective and damaged condition, the City of Danbury, its agents or employees, willfully ordered Steven Michalko to use said vehicle in the course of his employment for the City.

5. If a judgment should enter that Chrysler Corporation was in any respect negligent or liable to the plaintiff in this action, the City of Danbury may be or is liable for all or part

of plaintiff's claim against Chrysler Corporation, as said City was the active tort-feasor, and Chrysler Corporation was a passive tort-feasor, in that:

- (a) the City of Danbury was negligent in the maintenance, servicing, and or repair of said vehicle, as alleged hereinabove;
- (b) the negligence of the City of Danbury, rather than any allegations of negligence by Chrysler Corporation, was the direct, immediate cause of the accident and resulting injuries;
- (c) at the time and place and under the circumstances of said accident, the City of Danbury was in control of the situation to the exclusion of Chrysler Corporation;
- (d) Chrysler Corporation did not know of the negligence of the City of Danbury, had no reason to anticipate it, and had reason to rely upon the City of Danbury not to be negligent.

6. By reason of the foregoing, if the plaintiff should prevail against the Third Party Plaintiff, Chrysler Corporation, then the Third Party Defendant, City of Danbury, should indemnify

said Third Party Plaintiff for any judgment which the plaintiff may obtain, or any monies paid to the plaintiff in settlement of plaintiff's claims.

Sidewalks.

With the problem of not being able to order property owners to repair sidewalks, curbs, and gutters, the City has received various claims for which repair orders cannot be issued due to lack of authority under the present charter.

Therefore, during this interim period with no ordinance to facilitate repairs, we have estimated the costs of these repairs to be approximately \$7,500. for those sidewalks reported to this office during the period of June 25, 1980 through August 20, 1980. These funds would have to be appropriated if the City is to make these repairs.

Please note that a previous request for \$18,000. is under study by the Public Works Committee and the Claims Committee of the Common Council.

Change Procedures

Mr. James Cavanaugh of the State Energy Office was contacted and informed of our request to substitute segments of our planned projects.

After examining the Danbury Winter Energy Plan, Appendix 6 made the following suggestions:

1. No mention was made to insulate or retrofit any other schools except that were mentioned in this Appendix 6 and therefore, not discussed at the Public Hearing February 26, 1980. (A hearing is required by law.)
2. Paragraph 2 will now be done by the use of other funds.
3. Draft and present the substitute proposal to a new public hearing or to the Common Council. (Suggest the Common Council due to time element.)
4. When proposal is approved, it should be forwarded to Margaret Mary Curtin, Undersecretary, Intergovernmental Relations Division, Office of Policy and Management, 80 Washington St., Hartford, Conn. 06115. The letter should contain all information pertaining to the change.

Mr. Winkelstern, Energy Auditor, should at once prepare proposal and cost factor to be submitted to next Common Council meeting in September.

ENERGY CONSERVATION PROJECTS ON MUNICIPAL BUILDINGS

1. Installation of room control thermostats to replace the present zone control system at Park Avenue School. The present zone control system has three and four classrooms controlled by one thermostat. This causes overheating in some of the rooms in order to provide minimum temperature in the last rooms on the pipe run. Room control thermostats would provide that each room would be on individual control and eliminate the overheating. This will provide every savings as well as providing a more healthful environment for the children and teachers by having uniform temperatures. Estimated cost of project is \$12,000.00 with an estimated fuel savings of 5%. Current fuel usage is 50,000 gallons per year, therefore, savings will be 2,500 gallons or about \$2,250.00 per year. Payback is estimated at 5 1/3 years.

2. Installation of an energy monitoring and control system at Danbury High School. This system would allow an automatic programmed set-back of thermostats for unoccupied areas of the school and the automatic start of boilers at the optimum time to bring the building back up to temperature without any unnecessary lead time. The system uses a computer to analyze inside and outside conditions and then programs proper control settings. The system installation would cost \$27,000* with an expected savings of 10% in fuel. With present fuel usage of 175,000 gallons per year, the payback period would be less than two years.

*Cost Break-down:

Installation	\$16,000
Monthly Service Charge (Rental of phone lines and computer)	7,200/year
Maintenance (Parts and Labor)	4,500/year

3. Replacement of existing defective thermostats with new ones at Mill Ridge Intermediate School. The present thermostats are obsolete, defective, and cannot be calibrated properly. Therefore, in many areas of the school there are overheating problems. New thermostats would eliminate such problems and effect a fuel savings as well as a better school environment. Estimated cost is \$5,000.00 with an estimated fuel savings of 5%. Current fuel usage is 46,000 gallons per year; therefore, a savings is expected of \$2,000.00 per year resulting in a payback in 2 1/2 years.

The estimated total costs for the above-mentioned programs is \$44,700.

The figures were revised when the engineering was completed with the following estimates:

The energy management system was investigated and presented to the Board of Education who intends to pay for the system using the fuel savings.

Therefore there is a balance of \$14,800.00 left from my portion of \$44,700.00 or a balance of \$31,100.00 from the total grant.

Therefore, I propose to do the following projects until funds are exhausted. The prices are preliminary estimates and are subject to revision as final specifications are drawn.

On the advice of Councilman Vincent J. Scialabba, I am writing to you, on behalf of our Association, for assistance in regards to the present condition of Indian Avenue (The Cedars).

It is a small, dirt road approximately 900 feet long and leads directly to Candlewood Lake. Originally, the homes on the road were summer homes, however, in the last 15 years, 11 of the 16 homes have become permanent residences. The increase in year round traffic has made the road dangerously unsurpassable.

Our organization has been taking on the responsibility of maintaining and repairing the road. In all cases, it has been a unified effort of everyone "pitching in" on any given Sunday. Most of us have been here for 25 years or more and the repairs to the road are becoming beyond our physical capabilities.

We pay approximately \$15,000 a year in taxes and in our opinion, we believe the City of Danbury should "pitch in" too. We are not asking for extensive repair. Some filling in where required and general grading would solve the problem.

We respectfully request your support in this matter for the passibility and availability of the road is a matter of life and death to our senior citizens.

We would like to bring to your attention a very serious drainage problem that have developed on this street. We live on Oakland Avenue at the end of Walnut Street where the pavement ends. This drainage problem have developed over a period of time and no one seemed to be doing anything to correct it. We have talked with several departments but everyone just past it on to someone else and nothing gets done.

Everytime it rains the water builds up in the street and it looks like a big pond. When the water rises to a certain level it runs into everyone's basement. We also have a problem getting in or out of the driveways when the water is covering the street. One of the neighbors drove through the water and lost her brakes. She had to run into the corner of the house to keep from running into the brook in back of the house.

This drainage problem also becomes a health hazzard when the water stands for any length of time. Children have a tendency to play in or near the stale water. One kid became ill after fallening in and she had to be taken to the emergency room for treatment.

During the winter this become a very hazzardous situation. No one can get in or out with there cars because of the icy condition.

Enclose you will find some pictures showing the above situation. We would appreciate it very much if someone can look into this drainage problem and see if anything can be dome to correct it. The next time we have a hard rain we would like for one or both of the councilmen of this ward to come and see for themselves.

I have been a resident of Candlewood Vista for almost 40 years and was president of The Candlewood Vista Association when the fifty member organization installed drainage and paved Candlewood Drive and Brighton St. to ready them for incorporation into the then Town of Danbury road system, which was done many years ago.


My home is at the end of Brighton St., and it has become evident in the last several years that we stopped one catch basin short of doing a complete job.

The area in question is very wet in the late winter and into early summer and for this period of several months causes either an ice sheet or a flowing stream over and under the last hundred feet of Brighton St. until it reaches the first catch basin. One of the results of this action is the constant undermining of the blacktop and its eventual destruction.

I have conferred with David Gervasoni of the Public Works Dept., and he agrees with my suggested solution, a small catch basin at the end of Brighton St. and a 12 inch pipe across the road and into a swamp on my land. Total length of pipe is about 70 feet. Mr Gervasoni tells me the Public Works Dept. has some pipe which has been reclaimed from other projects. In addition, at my expense, I will run a drain across a vacant lot into said catch basin, which will eliminate any drainage onto the paved area of Brighton St, and will greatly prolong the life of the street.

I shall be glad to meet with you or any members of your committee to explain further or to conduct an on site inspection.





WHEREAS, Dancon Corporation is a real estate development corporation having water systems in the Danbury area and having an office and principal place of business at 77 West Street in said Danbury; and

WHEREAS, Dancon Corporation installed a water system in accordance with the regulations of the Public Utilities Control Authority and Health Department of the State of Connecticut at the Briar Ridge Development, situated at the corner of Miry Brook Road and Briar Ridge Road, in said Danbury; and

WHEREAS, said Briar Ridge water system was designed and constructed to supply residential dwellings in said development, the water mains in said development consisting of six inch (6") water pipes, the storage capacity being a thirty thousand (30,000) gallon metal storage tank, a five thousand (5,000) gallon pressure metal tank, and the water supply by way of artesian wells; and

WHEREAS, although nine (9) artesian wells have been drilled in said development, only four (4) are of sufficient yield, capacity, and quality to be presently used; and

WHEREAS, during the summer months, the water consumption increases considerably due to the extensive use of water; and

WHEREAS, during the summer months, the production of the wells now in use has fallen off and there have been drops in water pressure and outage of water to the consumers; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the well-being and health of the consumers that a new supply of water be obtained in the Briar Ridge Development; and

WHEREAS, there are no further locations available for the drilling of new artesian wells; and

WHEREAS, the City of Danbury has installed a new water system along said Briar Ridge Road, consisting of a sixteen inch (16") main located within fifteen (15) to twenty (20) feet of the Dancon Corporation's main; and

WHEREAS, Dancon Corporation, by Petition dated February 23, 1978, requested the City of Danbury for permission to connect into said City of Danbury's water main on an emergency basis so that the City water could be supplied and paid for on a metered basis in times of low pressure and outages in said Briar Wood system; and

WHEREAS, numerous conferences and meetings were had with the Public Works Commission of the Common Council for a period of sixteen (16) months and finally said Commission recommended to the Common Council of the City of Danbury that said Petition be approved; said approval by the Common Council being dated October 2, 1979; and

WHEREAS, at the time that the initial application was made by Dancon Corporation as above stated, on February 23, 1978, there was no water connection charge set forth in the Ordinances of the City of Danbury; and

WHEREAS, during said sixteen-month interim, an Ordinance was passed by the City of Danbury, setting forth certain connecting charges, said Ordinance being Section 21-49 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Danbury and providing for a water connecting charge for a two inch (2") meter of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00); and

WHEREAS, Dancon Corporation would be required to pay said connecting charge and ultimately said charge being absorbed by the water customers of said public utility over a period of years; and

WHEREAS, if said Petition had been acted upon sooner, said charge would not have been



In order to provide a more efficient fire department in Danbury, the Keep Danbury Alive committee is requesting you and the Common Council to establish an area-wide firefighting service plan whereby the towns of New Fairfield, Brookfield, Newtown, Redding, Bethel, Ridgefield, possibly Brewster, New York and Danbury share firefighting responsibilities in order to better save lives, property and money for the municipalities involved.

A similar plan has been adopted by the city of Norwalk with the surrounding towns of Westport, Wilton and New Cannan.

The plan calls for the fire station closest to the fire, regardless of what municipality it's in, to send engines to the fire in order to reduce the response time.

The Danbury-area firefighting plan might have, for example, the Redding Volunteer Fire Department responding to a blaze in the heavily populated Old Lanter Road section of the city rather than the city fire department assigned to it because the Redding company is closer than the Danbury company. After an initial investigation of this firefighting plan, the Keep Danbury Alive committee wants city officials to adopt it in order to make the city fire department a better cost efficient department.

HEALTH COMMITTEE REPORT

The Health Committee of the Common Council met on August 27, 1980 at 7:30 P.M. to discuss the safety violations at the schools and also to discuss the setting of fees for the licensing of food service establishments.

The Health Committee is carefully monitoring the actions which the Board of Education is taking to comply with the directive of the Health Department.

In discussing fees for the licensing of food service establishments, several concerns were expressed. Mr. Cummings advised that the largest expense to the Health Department is in the reinspection of those establishments which fail the initial inspections. Reinspections are more time consuming because of the necessity of recommending improvements and educating the restaurant personnel relative to the State Health Code.

The consensus of the committee is that the Health Department inspections represent both a service to the citizens of Danbury and a service to the owners of the establishments.

The total cost of these inspections is directly related to the number of restaurant establishments in Danbury and the number of restaurants requiring a reinspection.

After reviewing the cost statistics submitted by the Health Department, the committee would recommend that an annual fee of \$20.00 be charged for the normal quarterly health inspections. The committee also recommends that those establishments requiring re-inspections be charged a fee of \$50.00 for each re-inspection.

New establishments or establishments which have been remodeled are required to have a non-time extensive health inspection. The committee recommends that a fee of \$75.00 be charged for this one-time inspection.

The committee therefore recommends that a public hearing be scheduled for review of these recommendations.

New establishments or establishments which have been remodeled are required to have a ^{ONE} ~~non~~-time extensive health inspection. The committee recommends that a fee of \$75.00 be charged for this one-time inspection.

The committee therefore recommends that a public hearing be scheduled for review of these recommendations.





Sec. 1. Ordinance Revision Commission-Established; Membership.

There is hereby established by the common council of the City of Danbury, an ordinance revision commission consisting of seven resident electors of the City of Danbury, each of whom shall be appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the common council.

Sec. 2. Duration of Commission.

The commission shall exist for three years from the time of appointment within which time said commission shall report at least six times of its works and findings to the common council.

Sec. 3. Powers and Duties, Purpose.

Sec. 4. Minority Representation.



That the Code of Ordinances of Danbury, Connecticut is hereby amended by the redesignation of subsections 15-17 (i) through (l) as subsections 15-17 (j) through (m) and that the Code of Ordinances of Danbury, Connecticut is hereby amended by adding a section to be numbered 15-17 (i) which section reads as follows:






