

TO: Honorable Mayor James E. Dyer - Mayor of the City of Danbury.

SUBJECT: Minutes of the Common Council Meeting held June 3, 1980.

The Meeting was called to order at 8:00 O'Clock P.M. by his honor Mayor James E. Dyer, who led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

The Prayer was offered by Councilman Frederick Visconti.

Roll Call was taken by the City Clerk, Elizabeth Crudginton, with the following members being recorded as:

PRESENT: Council members - Delsin, McManus, Gallo, Walsh, Rinder, Scialabba, Repole, Kennedy, White, Murray, Ryan, Visconti, DaSilva, Turk, Boynton, Burke, Butera, Evans, Fabiano, Torian.

ABSENT: Councilman Cassano (who was reported to be away on business).

20 members present - 1 member absent.

A motion was made by Councilman Ryan and seconded by Councilman Visconti that the minutes of the Common Council meetings held on May 6th, May 13th and May 14th, 1980 be approved (reading of the minutes to be waived). Motion carried.

Councilman Turk requested that a correction to the minutes/be made in reference to the Land Acquisition Committee report recommending that the offer by Barbara Barry for the purchase of land on Coalpit Hill Road, be refused. A motion was duly made, seconded and passed that the Report be accepted and the offer of land refused.

Mayor Dyer announced and offered congratulations to:

- Councilman Evans who celebrated an anniversary.
- Councilman Ryan who celebrated an anniversary.
- Councilwoman C. McManus for her birthday and anniversary.
- Councilman Visconti who was married recently.

Mayor Dyer also announced the Dr. Frank R. Repole Adult Evening School Annual Closing Exercises and Dedication Ceremony, to be held at the D.H.S. Library, on June 17, 1980 at 7:30 P.M.

Councilman Murray requested referral to the Claims Committee and Assistant Corporation Counsel for Claims ( Attorney West). Mayor Dyer so ordered.

RESOLUTION - Settlement of the following Claim - Angelina DiPortogallo for \$750.00

A motion was made by Councilman Ryan and seconded by Councilman Visconti that the Resolution be adopted and Claim authorized to be paid. The Resolution was adopted by a roll call vote of 20 Ayes. Councilman Cassano was absent.

PETITION - Request for sewer installation for Fourth Street Area.

Councilman Murray requested referral to the Public Works Committee and Planning Commission. Mayor Dyer so ordered.

PETITION - Request for sewers in the areas of Nicholas Street, Woodside Avenue Extension, Garry Knolls and StarkTor - Marcy Terrace.

Councilman Ryan requested referral to the Public Works Committee and Planning Commission. Mayor Dyer so ordered.

PETITION - To correct hazardous drainage conditions on Kingswood Road

Councilman Murray requested referral to the Public Works Committee. Mayor Dyer so ordered.

COMMUNICATION - Request of C. J. Vavricka to correct erosion problems on Hillandale Road.

Councilman Gallo requested referral to the Public Works Committee. Mayor Dyer so ordered.

COMMUNICATION - Petition of George Davon to accept Canterbury Court.

Councilman White requested referral to the Public Works Committee and the Planning Commission. Mayor Dyer so ordered.

COMMUNICATION - Request to accept Hawthorne Cove.

Councilman Ryan requested referral to the Road Study Committee. (Council members - Burke, Murray, Kennedy, Gallo, Cassano, Delsin, Rinder). Mayor Dyer so ordered.

COMMUNICATION - Request of Rea Lubar, Inc. to construct a dwelling which is to be situated over the presently existing brook on Franklin Street Ext.

Councilman Gallo requested referral to the Public Works Committee and the Planning Commission - Mayor Dyer so ordered.

COMMUNICATION - Request from the Special Police Association of Danbury to amend the Code of Ordinances re: Section 8-18.

Councilman Ryan requested referral to an Ad-Hoc committee. Mayor Dyer appointed the following members to this committee: Boynton, Scialabba, J. Butera.

COMMUNICATION - Request from Chief Macedo for approval to purchase Protective Vests for each member of the Danbury Police Department, in the amount of \$15,120. The cost of these vests will be reimbursed to the City by "Protect a Life Fund" which is being sponsored by local civic organizations in the Danbury Area.

Councilman Murray requested referral to committee. Mayor Dyer appointed the following members to this committee: Councilmen White, Turk and Torian.

COMMUNICATION - Modification to the Council Chamber Dais. Mr. Winkelstern, Superintendent of Public Buildings submitted an estimate in the amount of \$1500.00 to enlarge the Chamber Dais.

Councilman Murray requested referral to the Public Works Committee. Mayor Dyer so ordered.

COMMUNICATION - Request of Councilman Murray for three members of the Common Council to be appointed as a liaison committee to the Stanley Lasker Richter Park Authority.

A motion was made by Councilman Ryan and seconded by Councilman Delsin that the Communication be accepted and committee appointed. Motion carried.

Mayor Dyer appointed the following members to this committee: Kennedy, Delsin, Rinder.

COMMUNICATION - To set public hearing for Sewer Assessments for Wooster Heights Area, Terra Haute Road, Dartmouth Lane, Cornell Road and Harvard Road.

When questioned as to the necessity of a public hearing on the Sewers which have already been constructed, Corporation Counsel Theodore H. Goldstein stated that public hearings were held for the proposed construction of sewers, in the past, but no hearings were held with regard to specific assessments for each individual lot owner.

Following discussion on the matter, a motion was made by Councilman Murray and seconded by Councilman Turk, to refer the Communication to the Public Works Committee. Motion carried.

COMMUNICATION - Councilman Ryan submitted a Communication and proposed Ordinance that would establish an Ordinance Revision Commission, to review the current code and make recommendations to the Common Council.

Councilman Ryan requested referral to committee. Mayor Dyer appointed the following members to this committee: Councilmen Ryan, Walsh, DaSilva.

COMMUNICATION - Request from Mayor Dyer for transmittal of all proposals regarding the operation of the Landfill, to the Public Works Committee, for their consideration.

Councilman Murray requested referral to the Public Works Committee. Mayor Dyer so ordered.

COMMUNICATION - Request from Chief Macedo for a transfer of funds to the Special Services Account 02-02-100-011011, in the amount of \$33,000 to cover the remaining five weeks of this fiscal year.

The initial request for this account, for this fiscal year, was \$180,000, but was cut to \$150,000.

This account is a wash item. The contractors for whom the officers work, are billed for the services and the monies received are deposited into the General Fund. Included is a 30¢ an hour charge which is retained by the City.

A Communication from Mr. John P. Edwards, Director of Finance, Acting, stated that the Council must only approve an increase of Account #621300 in the Revenue Section for Special Police Services along with an accompanying change in the Department Account 02-02-100-011011 in the amounts of \$33,000 each. There is no need for use of Contingency Funds.

A motion was made by Councilman Ryan and seconded by Councilman Visconti that the Communication be accepted and transfer from the Revenue Account be authorized.

Motion carried by a roll call vote of 20 Ayes. Councilman Cassano was absent.

COMMUNICATION - Request from the Budget and Finance Committee of the Danbury Board of Education for an additional appropriation of \$60,000.

Councilman Murray requested referral to the Common Council Liaison Committee to the Board of Education - Councilman Ryan as chairman. Mayor Dyer so ordered.

COMMUNICATION & CERTIFICATION - Request for a transfer of funds in the amount of \$1,000 to the Civil Service Account 022500 for advertising for new positions created by the re-organization of the Planning Department. Advertisements to be done in New York Times, Wall Street Journal, etc.

A Certification of funds was submitted by Mr. John P. Edwards, Director of Finance, Acting in the amount of \$1,000 available in the Workmen's Compensation Insurance Account #02-09-160-076600 to be transferred to the Civil Service Commission Legal and Public Notices Account.

A motion was made by Councilman Murray and seconded by Councilman Ryan that the Communications be accepted and transfer of funds authorized.

A motion was then made by Councilman Scialabba and seconded by Councilman Delsin to table the request.

The motion was denied by a roll call vote of 16 Nays - 4 Ayes. Councilmen Delsin, Walsh, Scialabba and Turk, voted Aye. All other members present voted Nay. (16) Councilman Cassano was absent.

Councilman Delsin then requested referral to committee. Mayor Dyer appointed the following members to this committee: DaSilva, Murray and Delsin.

Mayor Dyer stated that we intend to have a Special Meeting before the end of this fiscal year.

COMMUNICATION & CERTIFICATION - Request from the Building Inspector for \$450 for the gas account for the month of May and June, plus \$140 presently overdrawn.

Mr. John P. Edwards, Director of Finance, Acting, submitted a certification in the amount of \$590 as being available in the Contingency Account to be transferred to the Building Inspector Budget for gasoline. Mr. Edwards certified \$13,327 in the Contingency Account and a surplus of \$15,000 beyond what was anticipated for the 1980-81 Budget.

A motion was made by Councilman Boynton and seconded by Councilman Delsin that the Communication be accepted and transfer of funds authorized.

Motion carried by a roll call vote of 20 Ayes - No Nays - Councilman Cassano was absent.

COMMUNICATION & CERTIFICATION - Request from the Zoning Board of Appeals for an emergency appropriation in the amount of \$1,000 to cover expenses for Legal Advertising and for the meetings of May and June.

Mr. John P. Edwards, submitted a certification of funds stating that the Common Council can transfer from another agency in as much as no more Contingency funds or Fund Balance are available. Mr. Edwards suggested \$1,000 be transferred from Workmen's Compensation Insurance Account 02-09-160-076600.

A motion was made by Councilman Evans and seconded by Councilman Torian that the Communication be accepted and transfer of funds authorized. Motion carried by a roll call vote of 20 Ayes - No Nays - Councilman Cassano was absent.

COMMUNICATION & CERTIFICATION - Request from the American Red Cross for \$5,520 for their transportation program. Mr. Charles Frosch, Chairman of the Board of Directors stated that municipalities are eligible for 50% reimbursement from the Federal Government for the expenditures they make for this program.

A Certification was submitted by Mr. John P. Edwards, Director of Finance, Acting, in the amount of \$5,520 being available in the Workmen's Compensation Account #02-09-160-076600 to make a supplemental appropriation to the account for Elderly Transportation (Red Cross).

Councilman Scialabba requested referral to committee. Mayor Dyer appointed the following members to this committee: Murray, Delsin, DaSilva. Councilman Scialabba requested notification of the committee meeting.

#### DEPARTMENT REPORTS

Fire Chief - Fire Marshal - Health Inspector - Police Department Housing Inspector - WIC Program - Aviation Commission - Coordinator of Environmental & Occupational Health Services. Building Inspector

A motion was made by Councilman Ryan and seconded by Councilman Murray to dispense with reading Department Reports as all members have copies which are also on file in the office of the City Clerk, for public inspection. Motion carried.

#### AD HOC COMMITTEE REPORTS

REPORT - Councilman DaSilva submitted a report stating that the committee appointed to study a proposal by the registrars to extend their terms of office, from two to four years, met on May 19, 1980 at 8:30 P.M.

The Chairman read a letter received from Registrar Schmiedel and Tyrell requesting a withdrawal of this proposal. The Committee recommends that the Council accept this request, for withdrawal.

A motion was made by Councilman Evans and seconded by Councilman Murray that the Report be accepted and request withdrawn. Motion carried.

#### REPORT & ORDINANCE

REPORT - Councilman DaSilva submitted a report stating that the committee appointed to study an Ordinance for the appointment of Alternates to the Planning Commission, met at 8:30 P.M. on May 28, 1980. A proposed Ordinance was submitted with the Report.

A motion was made by Councilman Ryan and seconded by Councilman Murray to accept the Report. Motion carried.

Councilman Murray requested that the Ordinance be deferred for a public hearing to be held.

#### REPORT & ORDINANCE - Consent Calendar.

Councilman Murray submitted a committee report stating that a meeting was held on May 19, 1980 at 7:30 P.M. in City Hall. The committee submitted a proposed Ordinance for consideration. The following procedures will apply should the Ordinance be adopted, following a public hearing as required by Sec. 3-8 of the City Charter:

1. On Friday preceding the monthly Council meeting, the majority leader, minority leader and Council President, will meet and select items for tentative consideration as part of the consent calendar.

2. Thereafter the respective leaders shall report to their respective caucuses and receive input of the membership concerning the consent calendar.

3. The consent calendar will be typed and printed by the leadership on Tuesday before the monthly meeting.

4. The majority leader will open the business portion of the meeting by informing the public that any items on the consent calendar are on file and available for public inspection, and will thereafter move for adoption of the proposed consent calendar. The minority leader will second. After that time, any item may be removed by anyone member as the Ordinance describes.

A motion was made by Councilman Ryan and seconded by Councilman Delsin to accept the Report. Motion carried.

Councilman Ryan requested that the Ordinance be deferred for a public hearing to be held.

REPORT & ORDINANCE - Common Council members to be ex-officio members of any committee thereof.

Councilman Murray submitted a report stating that the committee concerning Sec. 2-97 - Council members as ex-officio members of all committees, met on May 19, 1980.

The intent of the proposed Ordinance is to allow all Council members to attend any committee meeting.

Mr. Murray submitted the following Ordinance:

Sec 2-97 - All members of the Common Council shall be ex-officio members of any committee thereof. Members in ex-officio capacity shall have no vote; and shall speak at the discretion of the chair.

A motion was made by Councilman Ryan and seconded by Councilman Delsin that the Report be accepted. Motion carried, with Councilman Scialabba voting Nay.

Councilman Ryan requested that the Ordinance be deferred for a Public Hearing to be scheduled.

REPORT - Request of Samuel M. Showah for sewers for South Cove Area and Danbury Town Park.

Councilman Fabiano, chairman of the Public Works Committee submitted a report stating that after their review of this petition, the committee recommends to the Common Council that this petition be denied on the grounds that it is part of the Candleview Ridge Area project that was deferred last year because of homeowners opposition.

A motion was made by Councilman Ryan and seconded by Councilman DaSilva that the Report be accepted and petition denied. Motion carried with Councilman Gallo voting no.

REPORT - Drainage - Shawn W. Fogarty - Spruce Mountain Trail.

Councilman Fabiano, submitted a report stating that the Public Works Committee recommends the City do the work as outlined in Mr. Fogarty's letter, subject to the stipulation that Mr. Fogarty provide all easements required by the Public Works Department.

A motion was made by Councilman DaSilva and seconded by Councilman Ryan to accept the Report as read. Motion carried unanimously.

REPORT - 911 Emergency number.

Councilman Boynton chairman, submitted a detailed report stating that the committee had met during the months of February, March and May, 1980, to review the feasibility, cost and need of creating a 911 emergency number.

The committee had several sources of input and important points of consideration. Total number of telephone lines in Danbury Central Office total 32,606.

The SNET Co. cannot or will not isolate Danbury residents into a 911 emergency number service; therefore 6,666 Bethel and Ridgefield residents would reach Danbury's emergency center.

In the opinion of the Police Chief and the Fire Chief, and Chief of Operations - Civil Preparedness, the present system is efficient and reliable.

The State of Connecticut has passed a bill designed to establish a State-wide emergency service.

In light of the above facts and others, it is the recommendation of the committee that the Council take no action on this subject at this time.

Mayor Dyer thanked Councilman Boynton and his committee for such a thorough report.

A motion was made by Councilman Ryan and seconded by Councilman DaSilva that the Report be accepted as read. Motion carried.

REPORT - Light for the Manger at Elmwood Park

Councilman DaSilva submitted a report stating that the committee met on May 28, 1980. Councilman DaSilva informed the committee at that time, through the Mayor's Aide, Robert Steinberg, he contacted a local electrical company who will install the light free of charge, when notified.

Mr. Steinberg will take charge of the Chamber of Commerce who will absorb the cost of electrical power. Chairman DaSilva will contact the Catholic War Veterans to appraise them of this proposal.

A motion was made by Councilman Evans and seconded by Councilman Walsh to accept the Report as read. Motion carried.

REPORT - Traffic problems on Golden Hill Road.

Councilwoman C. McManus submitted a report stating that the committee appointed to consider a traffic problem on Golden Hill Road, met on May 29th with the City Engineer and several residents of Golden Hill.

The attending residents discussed the many dangers of the road and the numerous accidents which have occurred because of the narrowness of the bridge, the slippery finish of the road, the sharp curve and the speeding motorists.

The committee recommended four corrective measures:

1. Mr. Schweitzer will inspect the Golden Hill, Breezy Hill intersection to determine if resurfacing could improve the traffic conditions.
2. Mr. Fusek will be contacted in regard to installing protective poles in the front of 3 residences.
3. Chief Macedo who was unable to attend the meeting, will be requested to provide an enforcement drive on Golden Hill Road in order to reduce the possibility of an accident, and will also be requested to institute a traffic count.
4. Any corrective measures, as determined necessary by the City Engineer, including bridge reconstruction and the modification of the angle at the intersection of Breezy Hill, will be cost estimated and funding will be recommended for inclusion in the Capital Budget for 1981.

A motion was made by Councilman Delsin and seconded by Councilman Ryan to accept the Report as read. Motion carried.

REPORT - Request of Jose Nunes for sewer & water - Triangle St.

Councilman Gallo submitted a Sewer and Water extension committee report recommending that the petition be granted with the following conditions and restrictions:

1. The petitioner shall bear all costs relative to the installation of said sewer and water line.
2. The petitioner shall submit as-built drawings of this extension, prepared by a licensed Connecticut Land Surveyor, for approval by the City Engineer.
3. Detailed Engineering Plans and Specifications are to be approved by the City Engineer and the Superintendent of Public Utilities prior to the start of construction.
4. If required, a Warranty Deed in a form satisfactory to the Corporation Counsel shall be executed by the petitioner conveying to the City of Danbury all right, title, interest and privileges required hereunder, and said Deed shall be held in escrow for recording upon completion of installation.
5. That upon completion of installation, title to said sewer and water line within City Streets, and any necessary documents be granted to the City in a form which is acceptable to the City Engineer and Corporation Counsel.
6. The petitioner shall convey ownership of and easements to all or such portions of the sewer and water lines as the City Engineer's office determines are of potential benefit to other landowners in the City. Should another, other than the petitioner hold title to any land involved in the approval, then consent prior to any installation or hook-up shall be furnished in a form satisfactory to the City Engineer and Corporation Counsel.
7. No Certificate of Occupancy shall be issued until the above requested forms, documents, plans, etc. are received and the City owns the extended sewer and water lines.

A motion was made by Councilman Fabiano and seconded by Councilman Burke that the Report be accepted as read. Motion carried with Councilmen Murray and Ryan voting Nay.

REPORT - Councilman Thomas Evans, Chairman of the Land Acquisition Committee, submitted a report by the committee, recommending that the property on Eden Drive, offered for sale to the City by Brockett Realty, be refused.

A motion was made by Councilman Turk and seconded by Councilman DaSilva that the Report be accepted as read and the offer denied. Motion carried.

REPORT & RESOLUTION - Redevelopment Agency Land Disposition.

Councilman Kennedy submitted a final committee report recommending the following Resolution be adopted:

WHEREAS, the Redevelopment Agency of the City of Danbury has received an offer from Guilherme F. and Aurora A. Bernardine to purchase and develop Disposition Parcel S/20-1 in the Mid-Town East Neighborhood Development Project, Conn. A-4; and

WHEREAS, Section 8-137 of Chapter 130 of the Connecticut General Statutes, Revision of 1958, as amended, requires that a Redevelopment Agency obtain the approval and concurrence of the legislative body of the municipality prior to entering into a contract for the sale or lease of land in an urban renewal project area; and

WHEREAS, the Agency has requested the approval of the Common Council of the City of Danbury of the aforesaid land disposition and has requested authorization for the Mayor of the City of Danbury and the Chairman of the Agency to execute a Land Disposition Agreement on behalf of the City and the Agency, respectively and has further requested authorization from the Mayor of the City of Danbury to execute and deliver the Deed of Conveyance for Disposition Parcel 2/20-1:

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE Common Council of the City of Danbury:

1. That the Mayor of the City of Danbury and the Chairman of the Agency are hereby authorized and directed to execute said Land Disposition Agreement on behalf of the City of Danbury and the Agency, respectively; and
2. The Mayor of the City of Danbury is hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver the Deed of Conveyance for Disposition Parcel S/20-1.
3. That the authority and direction herein granted and given shall be conditioned upon the relocation of the driveway servicing the subject parcel as far as possible from the intersection of Main and Liberty Streets; and further conditioned upon the establishment of certain landscaping buffers in accordance with the recommendations of the Tree Warden of the City of Danbury.

A motion was made by Councilman Turk and seconded by Councilman Ryan to accept the Report. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Councilman Delsin and seconded by Councilman Evans that the Resolution be adopted.

The Resolution was adopted by a roll call vote of 20 Ayes - Councilman Cassano was absent.

Mayor Dyer then granted extensions to all pending committees.

COMMUNICATION - The Danbury Health Department has conducted an investigation into possible health and safety violations in our school laboratories.

The problems are longstanding and the Mayor urged that a committee be established to review the recommendations and to ascertain the best way to finance the necessary repairs.

Councilman Murray requested referral to the Health Committee, with Councilwoman C. McManus as chairman. Mayor Dyer so ordered.

COMMUNICATION & CERTIFICATION - Request from Judge Richard L. Nahley for a transfer of funds in the amount of \$1,050 to the Probate Court Budget due to unanticipated increases in the cost of postage, printing & binding and office supplies.

A Certification was submitted by Mr. John P. Edwards, Director of Finance Acting, in the amount of \$1,050 available in the Workmen's Compensation Insurance Account to be transferred to the Probate Court:  
 \$50 - Postage      \$900 - Printing & Binding      \$100 - Office Supplies.

A motion was made by Councilman Delsin and seconded by Councilman Evans that the Communication be accepted and transfer of funds authorized. Motion carried by a roll call vote of 19 Ayes - Councilman Ryan abstained from voting and Councilman Cassano was absent.

COMMUNICATION - Reappointment by Mayor Dyer of John J. Addressi to the Redevelopment Agency for a term to expire January 1, 1985.

A motion was made by Councilman White and seconded by Councilman Delsin that the Communication be accepted and re-appointment confirmed. Motion carried unanimously.

COMMUNICATION - Appointment by Mayor Dyer of Janet Schaffer as an alternate elector member of the Environmental Impact Commission for a term to commence this date (June 3, 1980) and expire December 1, 1982.

A motion was made by Councilman Repole and seconded by Councilman Delsin that the Communication be accepted and appointment confirmed. Motion carried unanimously.

COMMUNICATION - Appointment by Mayor Dyer of Samuel Deibler to the Equal Rights and Opportunities Commission for a term to commence this date 6/3/80, and expire August 1, 1981.

A motion was made by Councilman White and seconded by Councilman Ryan that the Communication be accepted and appointment confirmed. Motion carried unanimously.

COMMUNICATION - Promotion by Mayor Dyer of Joseph Gowel, to the position of Assistant Chief in the Danbury Fire Department at a starting salary of \$21,575.00, effective Monday, June 9, 1980.

Councilman Walsh requested referral to committee. Mayor Dyer appointed the following members to this committee: Councilman Cassano, Councilman Walsh and Councilwoman Rinder.

COMMUNICATION - Installation of lighting at the Danbury High School Football Field. (Not listed on the Agenda)

A motion was made by Councilman Ryan and seconded by Councilman Delsin that this Communication be placed on the Agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

COMMUNICATION - Lighting at the Danbury High School Football Field.

The purpose and objective of this presentation is for the DHS Boosters Club to obtain permission from the Board of Education, to install and maintain lights at the DHS Football Field at no cost to the Board of Education or the Danbury taxpayers.

Mayor Dyer requested prompt attention to this communication in that it would be best to proceed with installation of lighting at the DHS Field while the grandstands are being reconstructed.

Councilman Evans requested referral to the Public Works Committee. Mayor Dyer so ordered.

Mayor Dyer announced that anyone from the audience wishing to address the Council may do so at this time, as the business of the Council was concluded.

Mr. Harry Kessler spoke, opposing the request for additional funds for the Board of Education. (\$60,000).

Mr. Kessler spoke in opposition to extending terms for the Registrars. Mayor Dyer informed Mr. Kessler that this matter had been withdrawn.

Mr. Kessler also commented on the Ordinances re: Legislative Reform - (Consent Calendar) - Council members to be ex-officio members of all or any committees and an Ordinance Revision Commission.

Mayor Dyer stated that public hearings will be scheduled on these Ordinances before final action is to be taken by the Common Council.

There being no further business to come before the Common Council, a motion was made by Councilman White and seconded by Councilman Gallo that the meeting be adjourned at 9:55 P.M. Motion carried.
