I am please to provide you with an update to our goals and objectives outlined in our Ten Year Plan to address the housing related issues our residents are facing, share in some exciting news and ask for your support.

On behalf of Danbury Housing Partnership we are pleased to announce that five (5) local banks and the Housing Authority of the City of Danbury, (HACD), have each become a major contributing sponsor of our annual breakfast and most importantly, their funding, will underwrite the cost of the Annual Project Homeless Connect, in December.

Fairfield County Bank, Newtown Savings Bank, Savings Bank of Danbury, Union Savings Bank and Webster Bank have joined with HACD and contributed \$1500.00 each to our efforts outlined in the Ten Year Plan to End Homelessness. These funds will assist us in our third annual Breakfast to be held at the Amber Room on October 7, 2010. To date, we have over 20 table sponsors who will be paying for the table and bringing their guest. Additionally, these donations will assist the Continuum of Care with the Annual Project Homeless Connect to be held at Western Connecticut State University, Bill Williams Gym on December 10, 2010. Breakfast expenses should not exceed \$5,000. Items should include, but not limited too, Amber Room costs, awards, flowers, table arrangements, public awareness advertising, etc...

Project Homeless Connect expenses should not exceed \$6,000.00. Items should include, but not limited too, doctor's visits, eyeglass, clothing, transportation, food, DMV ID card, personal care products, etc... The items purchased are proposed to be done in increments of +/- \$1,000.

The Danbury Housing Partnership also collaborated with Danbury Downtown Council, HACD, & Fairfield County Community Foundation to leverage funding for a 2 to 1 match for WIC, Senior Voucher Program & SNAP recipients to receive increased purchasing power at the CityCenter Farmers' Market. Our donation of \$950.00 assisted in securing \$10,000.00, in grant funds. This has been a fantastic success providing increase nutritional and health value to our very low income population.

We request your approval and acceptance of all funding into DBYHOUSPART Account number 5679, and the acknowledgement of the efforts for these events, and the subsequent expenditures.
