**RE: Monthly report for February 2011**

Dear Mayor Boughton and Members of the City Council:

I am pleased to present the Public Works Department report for the month of February.

Snow removal for the school roofs became a high priority for the beginning of the month. Two private contractors worked at Shelter Rock, Park Avenue and Mill Ridge Primary Schools. In addition, personnel from Parks Maintenance and Building Maintenance were deployed to perform snow removal and were supplemented with paid and volunteer fire department personnel. Our school district was one of a few in the state that did not close down due to safety concerns from heavy snow loads on roofs.

I would like to recognize and thank the fire department staff who volunteered to partner with the Public Works Department on this most important task. The volunteers did an outstanding job and their service is deeply appreciated. I want to also thank the Building Department inspectors for working with us to perform inspections and monitoring the snow removal.

When possible, several crews were out filling potholes. A few years ago, the City purchased an asphalt recycling machine to use leftover asphalt from previous projects for pothole filling. This machine has more than paid for itself.

In January 2010 CL&P proposed a pole attachment agreement which would force municipalities to forfeit their rights to make new attachments of traffic, police and fire signal wires and telecommunications fiber if they did not sign the agreement. The agreement would have imposed significant fines for existing “unauthorized and “non-conforming” attachments.

Thanks to Corporation Counsel Robin Edwards, the advocacy of the CT Council of Municipalities, West Hartford, Manchester, Stamford, Glastonbury and Danbury, CL&P’s agreement was largely rejected by the DPUC. As a result, the DPUC’s decision includes “grandfathering” all existing pole attachments and released all liability for unauthorized, non-conforming fees. A reasonable cap on fees for new attachments was established which were considerably less than when originally proposed.

I would like to thank Robin Edwards for her remarkable efforts on behalf of the City. She had to travel many days to meetings and devoted countless hours to this endeavor. The City of Danbury was spared the payment of many thousands of dollars in fines and penalties by CL&P because of her efforts.

I will be signing the agreement, which will be in place should we need to do pole attachments and other related work on CL&P owned poles.

**Construction Services report submitted by Thomas H. Hughes III, Superintendent:**

**Backus Avenue Bridge over Miry Brook:** The project was bid in December with a spring construction start. Project was completed and opened to traffic on October 22, 2010. Semi Final inspection was held on November 2, 2010. The project is now in the closeout phase with ConnDot.

**B.I. Access Project:** (Earthmovers) We have extended the grant & project through the Department of Economic Development till 12/11. This will allow us to use the remaining grant monies to install additional sidewalk and lighting on the median as you enter Old Ridgebury Road from Mill Plain Road. The change order for the additional work has been approved and executed. The additional work is at no cost to the City of Danbury and is fully funded by the State of CT DECD. We have scheduled a meeting with the contractor to go over the remaining additional work.

**White Street ARRA Project:** The contract was bid with A&J Construction as the low bidder. The contractor completed the paving on 8/30/10 and is at substantial completion work. We have requested to do some additional work on White Street under the project’s ARRA funding. ConnDot has agreed with our request to install an additional 1,000 L.F. of sidewalk throughout the project limits. We also have submitted some additional widening on the south side of White Street east of the Locust Avenue intersection. This work will be done in the spring. This is fully funded at no cost to the City of Danbury.

**Lincoln Avenue:** The contractor will complete these remaining items as weather conditions permit we have an April 11, 2011 start date.

**Tarrywile Parking Lot:** The parking lot has been completed, using our in-house resources and City Bid Lists to reduce the cost. Punch list remains and will be completed as weather conditions permit.

**Tarrywile Mansion:** Renovations to the kitchen have been completed: new floor, counter top, faucets and sink installed. Two new Exterior French doors were also installed. This work is being funded by a LOCIP grant at no cost to the City of Danbury.

**School Roof Snow Removal:** Completed removing snow from four Elementary Schools: Shelter Rock, Park Avenue, Mill Ridge Intermediate and Mill Ridge Primary.

**Stadley Rough School Roof Project:** Reviewed project scope and drawings. The Engineering Division has the project out to bid with a start date upon the close of school this June.

**Library Place Sidewalks:** Reviewed drawings and contract documents. The Engineering Division has the project out to bid with a spring start.

**Engineering report submitted by Farid L. Khouri, P.E., City Engineer:**

**Assessment Projects:**

- Olive Street and Tilden Road Area Sanitary Sewer Extension: Responses for mail survey were received and sent out to City Council. A public hearing will be scheduled soon.
- Fairway Drive, Royal Pine Drive, Country Way and Hausmann Road Sanitary Sewer Assessment: In-house design and estimate are complete. Mail survey was sent out. Results have been received and will be compiled for the Council for final determination.
- Shannon Ridge Road, Fairlawn Avenue, Edgewood Street and Westville Avenue Extension Sanitary Sewer and Water Main Extension for Fairlawn Avenue and Myrtle Avenue: In-house design and estimate are complete. Results have been received and will be compiled for the Council for final determination.
- Ivy Lane, Cedar Street and Sylvan Drive Water Main Extension: Preliminary design completed. Cost estimate completed. Mail survey will be sent out next month.
- Deepwood Drive Sanitary Sewer Extension: Preliminary design and cost estimate to be completed within the next couple of months.
- Juniper Ridge Drive Sanitary Sewer Extension: Preliminary design completed. Cost estimate completed. Mail survey to be sent out within the next couple of months.
- East Gate Road Sanitary Sewer Extension: Working on a preliminary design.
- Karen Road Sanitary Sewer Extension: Started compiling information for project.
- Hawthorne Terrace Water: Design work for Phase III to begin within the next couple of months.

**Traffic:** Review of land-use development plans; handling of public complaints and routine repair and maintenance of traffic control signal devices and pavement markings.

**Staff Engineers:**

- Review various site plans, water and sewer applications, special exception applications, and subdivision applications for land-use approval of on-going development projects throughout the City.
- Field inspection of sanitary sewer, water mains and new roads are performed regularly on various developments.
- Review of drainage problems, including site visits, analysis and design.

**Survey crew:** Verification of R.O.W. on tree issues and locating storm drainage outfalls for the entire City using GPS equipment. Preparing surveys for in-house design of City projects.

**Highway Division report submitted by Duke Hart, Superintendent of Public Services:**

In the month of February the Highway Division responded to four (4) storm events this month. The construction crew was busy with plow repairs after each storm. Other staff was engaged in dredging, ice-cutting and snow removal at locations throughout the City. Pothole patching was performed at many locations. Three crews have been assigned to this task. A two-man crew has been assigned to mailbox repairs. One basin repair was performed on Crosby Street. No new signs were installed by there were numerous repairs made.

The long awaited Christmas tree pick-up has been finally started. The trees have been snow covered and the crew is now able to find them due to the melting that has occurred. We appreciate the assistance of the Parks Maintenance Division with this undertaking. The recycling and garbage trucks are out as weather permits.

**Parks Maintenance submitted by Duke Hart, Superintendent of Public Services:**

With four (4) weather events during the month, the crews were hard at work clearing snow and ice from the City maintained sidewalks and downtown crosswalks. The assistance of the Forestry Division was very much appreciated with the plowing of all of the schools and City parking lots. The staff also partnered with the Highway Division to battle the potholes and assist with the Christmas tree pick-up.

Winter maintenance on the mowing equipment continued to prepare for the spring season.

**Forestry Division report submitted by Mark Miller, Foreman Forestry Department:**

The Forestry Division was focused on snow related tasks during the month of February. The crew partnered with the Parks Maintenance Division to remove snow from school roofs. We also assisted the Highway Division in performing snow removal in the downtown area.

The Division responded to storm damage at the following locations: Westville Avenue, Main Street, Wheeler Drive and Great Plain Road.

**Public Buildings report submitted by Rick Palanzo, Superintendent of Public Buildings:**

**EECBG Grant:** At the recommendation of our project administrator, we have made a change in the energy projects we had been considering in favor of slightly different projects that would have a greater impact upon savings. We have submitted these changes to the Department of Energy for their approval. We are confident the projects will be approved. We are planning to perform smaller energy projects utilizing our in-house staff which will allow us to stretch the grant allocation and accomplish more work. The Department of Energy has approved the use of the grant funds to compensate the city for the labor.

**City Hall:** The contractor that has been awarded the work to install an accessible lavatory for the third floor will sign his contract in early March. Once the contract has been signed he can begin to gather his materials and the work can begin.

**Old Jail Buildings:** The Old Jail will receive some TLC to its facade with repairs to deteriorating masonry and wooden accents. The Old Jail will retain its historical appearance and receive a new lease on life through the use of modern construction materials. This has been awarded and we are awaiting better weather for the project to begin. When we receive state funds we will perform a few minor changes to the old jail to accommodate the WIC program. Once they have moved in to the old jail we will decommission the McLean house.

**Capital Improvement Projects:** The Capital Improvement project at Hatters Park Pavilion will begin in March. The contractor is currently preparing for the advent of the construction season. The Pavilion will receive repairs and maintenance which will enhance its viability and safety.

**Danbury Public Schools:** The heating plant replacement project has been awarded to AKF engineers. They are beginning to evaluate the schools and will propose new, modern, efficient, boilers and burners that will heat our schools reliably. Our goal is have the design completed by early April so we can bid and hire a contractor to begin work after school closes for the summer in June 2011.

**Snow Removal:** The staff worked in cooperation with the entire Public Works Department in clearing snow from school driveways, parking lots and from many school roofs. This was a daunting task and required additional resources to manage this task correctly. The good news is that we had no structural roof failures to any City of Danbury public building.

**Requests for Maintenance and Repairs:** Attached please find the statistical analysis for repairs and maintenance work that the Public Buildings Mechanics engaged in during the month of February 2011. In the month of January we received 167 new work requests and completed 70 work requests. In reviewing this report, you will find the repair time that was expended in major work categories, (current month versus previous month). Also listed is the total number of work order hours completed, (current month versus the previous month).

Our department was heavily engaged in snow plowing of school parking lots and snow removal from school roofs with a total of 414.0 man-hours dedicated to this service. The next largest area of concentration was in electrical work, utilizing 66.50 man-hours of labor. Plumbing work came in as the third highest category with 49.50 man-hours.
