RE: Monthly report for April 2012

Dear Mayor Boughton and Members of the City Council:

I am pleased to present the Public Works Department report for the month of April.

In April, we kicked-off the study pertaining to the school overcrowding with the architectural firm that was selected. A detailed scope of work was reviewed. Several meetings were held with internal, architectural, and school staff. We are eager to receive preliminary reviews of the selected schools that would potentially be expanded to accommodate the growing population of the school district. I will report next month on any details that will be available.

We are planning to have our Fifth Annual Public Works Awareness and Employee Recognition Day in May. All of the divisions will be showcasing the tasks that they perform for the Public Works Department. The Hat City Public Works Department is a very visible department, and based on the current work load, it is critical that all divisions work well together to be an effective and efficient organization. Holding an event such as this one fosters team work and staff recognition and goes a long way toward loyalty and dedication to the City.

Construction Services report submitted by Thomas H. Hughes III, Superintendent:

Backus Avenue Bridge over Miry Brook: The project is now in the closeout phase with ConnDot. Change Orders I & J submitted (Final Change Order Zero Balance). The project records have been submitted to ConnDot Auditors in Newington.

B.I. Access Project: (Earthmovers) The Broad Band system is 65% complete and has been functioning in test mode presently. We expect the system to be complete by the end of June. Then enter the closeout phase with the engineer VHB & DECD and final out the project.

White Street ARRA Project: With the remaining balance of our ARRA funding ConnDot has supported a formal request from the City of Danbury to install Dura-Threm crosswalks on White Street. We are in the process of preparing a change order to incorporate this additional work into the contract. This additional work will be at no cost to the City of Danbury.

Tarrywile Park: We have the budgetary number to replace the mansion roof and gutters. We are in the process of verifying funding with the Tarrywile Park Authority Administration to move forward into the bidding phase.

Head Start: The next phase of the project has been bid. The award is pending a scope review and the construction will be managed by Construction Services.

DHS ADA Compliance: An ADA compliance walk through was conducted on December 09, 2011 with the State of Connecticut BSF Dr. Adrian Wood, Bureau of Accountability, Compliance and Monitoring. There are several items remaining, including classroom furniture, which BOE will address. Construction Services has completed modifications to the Science Laboratories for ADA compliance. Dr. Wood commented he was very pleased with the significant progress made by the City of Danbury to come into ADA compliance. We are awaiting confirmation that the BOE has completed their portion and schedule a final walk through with Dr. Woods.

Germantown Road & Hospital Avenue Intersection Improvement: Construction Services has completed the intersection improvement project. The project was completed using in house forces and supplemented with the use of our City & State Bid lists. We completed the project on schedule and within budget, reflecting a large savings to the City of Danbury.

Middle River Road Bridge: Using our in-house resources for materials, contracting and construction administration will reflect in a significant savings to the City. The construction is at approximately 75% complete and all the boxes and structure wing walls have been poured. We expect to be completed by the second week of June.

DHS Window Replacement: The window contractor has been selected. Honeywell has submitted the shop drawings for the replacement windows and doors. Construction Services is working with the architect reviewing the shop drawings and RFI's submitted by Honeywell. The abatement contract was rebid the contract to be awarded to Oscars Abatement. The abatement contractor has signed the contract we held a coordination meeting with all parties. This will be a fast paced project administered by the Construction Services Division.

Spring Street Curb & Sidewalk: Construction Services has been working with the Engineering Division to review the scope of work. The project has been awarded to EDO Construction, the low bidder. We expect to start the project in June.

Engineering report submitted by Farid L. Khouri, P.E., City Engineer:

The following assessment projects are the only projects pending on the list based on residents' petitions:

1. Ryders Lane and Southern Boulevard Sanitary Sewer Extension: Preliminary design and cost estimate completed. Summary report sent to City Council for decision at May meeting.
2. Broad Street Sanitary Sewer Extension: Preliminary design and cost estimate completed. Mail survey was sent out.
3. Johnson Drive, East Pembroke Road and Hawley Road Sanitary Sewer Extension: Preliminary design and cost estimate completed. Mail survey to go out next month.
4. Butternut Lane, Bayberry Lane and Boxwood Lane Sanitary Sewer Extension: Working on preliminary design.
5. Hawley Road Extension Sanitary Sewer Extension: Working on preliminary design.

Long Ridge Road Bridge: Currently working on in-house design of the bridge. Working with Corporation Council on securing easement.

East Franklin Street Bridge: The City started the design to relocate the existing sewer in the brook with an above-ground pump station. Also, we will address the scour problem that exists in the abutment walls of the bridge during the sanitary sewer relocation.

Spring Street Sidewalk and Related Improvements: Project has been surveyed and designed in-house. Project was bid out, and the apparent low bidder is Edo Construction.

Germantown Road and Hospital Avenue Intersection Improvement: Work started and will be completed by May.

DHS Windows and Doors: Bid package #1 was awarded to Honeywell. In the summer, Honeywell will be working with Arrow Steel Window Corporation to complete the project. Bids for bid package #2 were open, and the apparent low bidder is Oscar's Abatement.

Head Start: Project was bid out and awarded to Banton Construction.

Traffic Engineer and his technicians are reviewing various land-use development plans; handling of public complaints and routine repair and maintenance of traffic control signal devices and pavement markings.

Staff engineers are reviewing various site plans, water and sewer applications, special exception applications, and subdivision applications for various land-use approvals of on-going development projects throughout the City. Field inspection of sanitary sewer, water mains and new roads are

performed regularly on various developments. Review various drainage problems, including site visits, analysis and design.

Survey crew verifies various R.O.W., prepares surveys and easements for in-house design of City projects and assists other divisions in locating utilities in the field.

Highway Division report submitted by Duke Hart, Superintendent of Public Services:

In the month of April, the Highway Division did numerous catch basin repairs and repaired the guard rail on Miry Brook Road. The construction crew did five (5) drainage repairs on Buckskin Heights Drive, Germantown Road, Darrell Road, Bear Mountain Road and East Gate Road.

The ball fields at Rogers Park and Hatters Park were regarded and repaired. During spring break, the crews concentrated on sweeping and patching potholes on the grounds of all of the City schools.

The spring clean-up is in full swing. Crews are out daily picking up leaf bags and bundled brush. The sign crew installed fifteen (15) new signs at three (3) locations and performed numerous sign repairs. Two sweepers have been out daily removing the winter salt and sand. Two pothole crews have also been out daily to keep up with the repairs.

The garbage truck continues to canvas the downtown area to pick-up the garbage cans and other debris. The recycle truck continues to be a popular stop for many of the residents.

Parks Maintenance submitted by Duke Hart, Superintendent of Public Services:

April was a busy month for the Park Maintenance Division. The crew started the downtown spring clean-up to remove sand and debris from all of the City building lots and sidewalks. Litter policing at the City's schools, playgrounds and parks is an on-going event.

The crews take great pride in the fields, and it shows. Preparation of the baseball, softball, lacrosse and soccer fields is in full swing for the upcoming season.

The maintenance of our spring/summer equipment is completed and ready to go.

Forestry Division report submitted by Mark Miller, Foreman, Forestry Department:

Arbor Day was celebrated with three (3) tree planting events. The Forestry Division assisted the Lions Club with the planting of a sugar maple in the playground area. The crew worked with the Danbury Garden Club at Pembroke School and at Lake Kenosia planting sugar maples.

The Division worked with Lewis Tree Company doing take-downs from the power lines. Removals were performed at the following locations: Pleasant Street, Cross Street, Middle River Road, and Grace Street.

Removals were performed at the following locations: Del View Drive, North Nabby Road, Great Plain Road, East Pembroke Road, Sommers Street, Rogers Park, the Farrington property, Rowan Street Park, Cedar Drive, Old Neversink Road, Forty Acre Drive and Old Shelter Rock Road.

Public Buildings report submitted by Rick Palanzo, Superintendent of Public Buildings:

EECBG Grant: There are three active projects being performed under this grant. The first is the replacement of pneumatic controls at City Hall with Direct Digital Controls. The second is the replacement of older exit signs with LED exit signs. The third is replacing the lighting at Hatters Hall with highly efficient LED lights. These projects are underway and should be completed over the next month.

City Hall: One of the last large EECBG projects is the conversion of the pneumatic controls to direct digital controls throughout city hall. About twenty years ago this project started but was never completed due to various reasons. With the available federal energy funds the city hall building will have many original operating controls replaced by higher efficiency, more accurate digital controls which will allow us to operate the environmental conditions within the building remotely. This project will take a few months to complete. This project has been awarded to SNE building systems and the work is well underway.

We are looking into replacing the seating in the City Council Chambers. The current seating has been in use since the building opened in the mid 1960's.

Hatters Park Building: The LED lighting at Hatters Hall has been installed and this work is completed.

Farrington Park – Westside Open Space: The chow house at the Farrington park has become vacant. We will begin the process of cleaning up the house and making it ready for a new tenant (rental). At the same time we will endeavor to make minor repairs to the main house to prevent deterioration.

Danbury Public Schools: The window replacement portion of this project is gearing up to begin in June. The heating (non-window) portion of this project is 99.9% complete.

Yankee Gas and the City are close to signing an agreement that will bring natural gas to Mill Ridge Intermediate and Mill Ridge Primary schools.

The Alternative School on Locust Avenue is currently undergoing a roof and gutter redesign that includes the cornice. The project has been awarded. The contract will be signed in May and work will begin in June, 2012. The built in gutter, rotten support structure and cornice work will be removed and replaced with a durable built in gutter that has a structural support that will prevent sagging and problems that the older design wrought. The final product will look like the current one but everything will be new from the bottom of the cornice to the top of the roof.

Old Library: The elevator at the Old Library is out of service pending replacement of the main lift piston. The old piston removal and replacement will require three different contractors to perform the necessary work before the elevator company can install a new piston. The funding for this repair is being carried in the Mayor's capital budget which begins in July.

Homeless Shelter: The project to replace the dormitory stairs and landing has been completed and is a nice addition to the Homeless shelter.

Tank Replacement Project: Fire HQ, Airport, City Hall: The DEP has required that several underground tanks at these locations be replaced with compliant models. TRC, our consulting engineers have been working with the appropriate department heads to design and specify appropriate compliant replacements. At the Fire HQ, and the Airport the underground tanks will be removed and replaced with above ground tanks. We have approved the design and bid the project. The contract has been awarded and signed. Work to begin as soon as TRC approves the submissions from the contractor. Construction will commence in June.

Library Plaza Fountain: We will be replacing the ferrous pump and valves with a stainless steel pump with stainless steel fittings and valves which will help to reduce the rusty water that has plagued the plaza fountain since its inception. We are also looking to make a site modification which will prevent the debris that finds its way into the fountain from blocking the water lines and damaging the pump. The work will probably begin and end in June, based upon delivery of the stainless steel component parts.

Requests for Maintenance Services: Attached please find the statistical analysis for repairs and maintenance work that the Public Buildings Mechanics engaged in during the month of April 2012. In the month of April we received 178 new work requests and completed 331 work requests. In reviewing this report, you will find the repair time that was expended in major work categories, (current month versus previous month). Also listed is the total number of work order hours completed, (current month versus the previous month).

Public Building mechanics were engaged in plumbing repairs with a total of 325.70 man-hours dedicated to this service. The next largest area of concentration was in Electrical repair work, utilizing 76.50 man-hours of labor. General HVAC came in as the third highest category with 34.50 man-hours.
