
In April, 2012, your consultant, Mr. Jack Kozuchowski, made a presentation to Pitney Bowes regarding the new "stewardship program" for the Still River Greenway. He described the design and installation of the native garden demonstration projects, including the location where the Greenway passes through our premises. Furthermore, Mr. Kozuchowski described his attempts to recruit 10 - 15 "stewards" who would adopt a plot or a function to sustain the Still River Greenway in the future and requested the participation of Pitney Bowes in this effort.
