The Woman's Club of Danbury/New Fairfield, Inc., was founded in 1982 by twenty civic-minded charter members. This goal is achieved by promoting volunteer service and common interests in civic, cultural and educational programs. Fellowship activities include museum trips, luncheons, bridge, golf, tennis, and book study and movie discussion groups.
