RESOLUTION

RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DANBURY

WHEREAS, the State of Connecticut Department of Emergency Services ("DEMS") and Public Protection, Division of Emergency Management and Homeland Security, is making grant funds available to municipalities through the FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, the DEMS will award these funds to the City of Danbury for purposes of emergency generator installation at various locations in various identified public buildings and water and sewer facilities; and

WHEREAS, the federal share will fund an anticipated 75% of the total cost of the grant; and

WHEREAS, if awarded, the local cash and/or in-kind services match in amount anticipated at 25% of the total cost is required.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT Mark D. Boughton, as Mayor of the City of Danbury, or his designees, Paul D. Estefan, as Director of Emergency Management, or David Day, Superintendent of Public Utilities, are hereby authorized to execute and file applications, contracts and agreements on behalf of the City of Danbury with the State of Connecticut Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection, and to execute on behalf of the City of Danbury all the applications, instruments, contracts and documents and accept payments and do all other things that may be necessary for state grants and loans.
