**RE: Monthly Report for September 2014**

Dear Mayor Boughton and Members of the City Council:

I am pleased to present the Public Works Department report for the month of September.

Winter preparations are underway. The parks and sprayscapes have been closed and winterized for the season. The Equipment Maintenance Division is working on the maintenance and preparation of all of our snowplowing and de-icing equipment. All of the drop-in sanders will be fully serviced and operational. In addition, a portion of our fleet has begun preparing for the leaf pick-up program. Construction and paving crews continue to complete projects and will continue to do so until weather becomes an issue.

Another successful Household Hazardous Waste Day collection was held in September. This annual event enables residents to dispose of hazardous waste materials in a safe and environmentally sound manner. This year's collection served 727 households.

Danbury, along with the other Region 5 municipalities, have met and discussed the proposed modifications to the General Permit for the Discharge of Stormwater from Small Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4). While all of the towns recognize the importance of protecting water quality, the proposed unfunded mandates are financially burdensome.

As chairman for the Association of Public Works Professionals for the Housatonic Valley, I sent a letter to DEEP expressing the concerns and reservations of the Region 5 public works directors.

I explained that the proposed Draft Permit requirements are economically unsustainable and are not practical or achievable. I also attended the information hearing on the Draft MS4 Permit. Several area CEO's and my colleagues will be specifically addressing issues at the full public hearing in December.

Please take a few moments to review the Division reports for a full scope of the many activities and projects that the Public Works Department is engaged in.

**Construction Services Report submitted by Thomas Hughes III, Superintendent:**

**Danbury City Center Skate Park:** The project has been completed with a small punch list. We have installed the memorial plaque dedicating the skate park in the memory of Davon Lasane. This project was designed in-house by the City of Danbury Engineering Division. The project administration is being performed in-house by the Construction Services Division.

**Osborne Street at Fifth Street Traffic Signal Installation:** ConnDot project 34-344, Construction Services has been approved by ConnDot to perform the contract administration and inspection of the project, eliminating the need to hire an outside consultant. The contractor, A.M. Rizzo, has completed the punch list and the project is complete. We are in the process of closing the project out with ConnDot.

**School Additions: Shelter Rock, Stadley Rough, Park Avenue and Mill Ridge Intermediate:** Construction Services is administrating the school addition projects. All four of the schools have been issued Certificates of Occupancy allowing the schools to be occupied.

**Mill Ridge:** Rizzo Corporation is moving forward with completing the punch list.

**Stadley Rough School:** Rizzo Corporation is moving forward completing the punch list.

**Shelter Rock School:** Rizzo Corporation is moving forward completing the punch list.

**Park Avenue School:** Worth Construction has been issued an extensive punch list and there are several open items needing completion.

**Spring Street Sidewalk & Paving:** The contract has been awarded to GEG Construction and a pre-construction meeting was held on August 28, 2014. The contractor will be issued a Notice to Proceed. The project is 80% complete and, weather permitting, will be completed on schedule and within budget. This project was designed in-house by the City of Danbury Engineering Division and is being administrated by the Construction Services Division.

**Foster Street Sidewalks, Drainage & Paving:** This project was bid and awarded to GEG Construction with a fall start. The project was designed in-house by the City of Danbury Engineering Division and will be administrated by the Construction Services Division. As like

the Spring Street project, the design and administration of the project will be performed in-house reducing the project costs.

**School Playgrounds:** South Street, King Street and Morris Street Schools playground designs have been completed. The playgrounds have been ordered, the existing playground equipment has been removed and we are ready to start the replacement of the playscape equipment. We expect to start the first week of November weather permitting.

**Mill Ridge Artificial Field:** Working with the Engineering Division on the conceptual field design.

**Clear Brook Road Bridge:** The Phase II deck replacement has been completed and the road reopened to traffic.

**Engineering Report submitted by Farid L. Khouri, P.E., City Engineer:**

The following assessment projects are the only projects pending on the list based on residents' petitions:

1. Butternut Lane, Bayberry Lane and Boxwood Lane Sanitary Sewer Extension: Working on preliminary design and cost estimate.
2. Hawley Road Extension Sanitary Sewer Extension: Working on preliminary design and cost estimate.

**East Franklin Street Bridge/Sanitary Sewer Pump Station:** Bridge work has been completed. We completed the in-house design to relocate the existing sewer in the brook with an above-ground pump station. Generator work has been completed and we are testing the equipment before we terminate the existing sewer line in the brook and the switch over has been completed.

**Spring Street:** Project was awarded and construction will begin next month and should be completed by the end of the year. CDBG funding is in place. The project consists of neighborhood enhancement work to sidewalk and pavement improvements. Sidewalk work has been completed. Project is approximately 75% complete.

**Foster Street:** In-house design and survey to Foster Street from West Street to West Wooster Street, Boughton Street and Bank Street were completed and the entire neighborhood project was bid out. The City reviewed the bids and selected the contractor but waiting on firm CDBG approval to start construction.

**Traffic Light – Lake Avenue/Shannon Ridge:** All plans and specifications have been completed and are approved by the State to bid out. The City bid the project and selected a contractor to perform the work. Preconstruction meeting was conducted and work is underway.

**Still River Channel Maintenance:** Property owners along the Still River Channel, who will be affected by and where access will be required, have been notified and permission to access the Still River Channel right of way through their property has been requested. We have secured the

sign offs from property owners. 90% of the work for Phase I has been completed and we are preparing the necessary documents for Phase II.

**Clear Brook Bridge:** Bridge had deteriorated and required the City to make temporary repairs. Temporary repairs to upstream of the bridge (North side) have been completed. We are working on repairs for South side of bridge. Work should be completed by next month.

**Backus Avenue Corridor Traffic Lights:** Plans and specifications have been accepted by the State. Construction completed. We are presently working on completing punch list items.

**Traffic Engineer and his Technicians:** are reviewing various land-use development plans and are handling public complaints and routine repairs and maintenance of traffic control signal devices and pavement markings.

**Staff Engineers:** are reviewing various site plans, water and sewer applications, special exception applications, and subdivision applications for various land-use approvals of on-going development projects throughout the City. Field inspections of sanitary sewer, water mains and new roads are performed regularly on various developments. The Staff Engineers also review various drainage problems which may include site visits, analysis and design.

**Survey Crew** verifies various R.O.W., and prepares surveys and easements for in-house design of City Projects, and assists other divisions in locating utilities in the field.

**Highway Division Report submitted by Duke Hart, Superintendent of Public Services:**

September was a very busy month for the Highway Division. The construction crews were involved in catch basin repairs and upgrades on Lee Mac Avenue, Patriot Drive, Shelter Rock Road and Ken Oaks Drive in preparation for paving. Drainage repairs were made on Beaver Brook Road, Memorial Drive, Hawley Road, Sandpit Road, Beckerle Street and Old Shelter Rock Road. A section of drainage pipe that was undersized and suffered a major wash-out was repaired and upgraded on Great Plain Road. A section of Hospital Avenue was trim milled before paving to repair a section of road damaged due to a water break. The City paving crew prepared and paved a section of Southern Boulevard, Terre Haute Road, Parkwood Terrace, Lamar Road, Hawley Terrace, Shepard Road, First Street Extension and Ledgemere Drive. Curbs, aprons and backfilling were finished on Pocono Point Road. The grading crew was pleased to assist the Parks Maintenance Division with the grading of the ball field at Stadley Rough School.

Two crews are dispatched on an almost daily basis patching pothole and repairing curbs and aprons. The sign crew was busy with the installation of eight new signs at six locations, in addition to numerous repairs due to accidents or vandalism. Staff and the garbage truck are dispatched daily to empty trash cans and pick up litter and illegal dumping. The crew continues

to mow intersections and remedy site line issues. The recycling truck is out daily and remains a very popular stop for the residents.

**Parks Maintenance Report submitted by Duke Hart, Superintendent of Public Services:**

The Parks Maintenance Division continued with the mowing and park maintenance programs at the City parks and schools during the month of September. The fields at Rogers Park, Hatters Park and Danbury High School are regularly maintained for the various sporting events that take place on a daily basis. The soccer fields at Kenosia Park are painted 3 days per week. The Candlewood Town Park beach was closed for the season.

Playgrounds at the schools and parks are mulched, inspected and repairs performed when needed to provide a safe play area for the children. The Hatters Park Pavilion is set-up and cleaned for events taking place at the facility.

On Fridays and Mondays the division is busy with preparation and clean-up at the City Center Green and Kennedy Park as well as Post Office Walk and Ives Street for the weekend activities in these areas. Trash removal at City parks and playgrounds is done four days per week. The flower beds in the downtown area and in other locations are watered when needed. Shrubs and bushes are trimmed regularly. In preparation for the Taste of Danbury celebration weekend, the City Center Green was watered, weeded, mulched and mowed.

**Forestry Division Report submitted by Mark Miller, Foreman:**

The Forestry Division was involved in several projects during the month of September. The crew pruned trees on Ives Street, Rogers Park and Mill Ridge School. Cut-backs and tree removals were performed at Ridge Road, Peck Road, White Street, Main Street, Deer Hill Avenue, Westville Avenue and Lake Avenue. Cut backs were performed on Shelter Rock Road in preparation for the paving project. Work was also done on Spring Street in preparation for the improvement project at that location.

Two elm trees were installed for the City Center parking space project. Additionally, an elm was planted on Chelsey Drive and at the park on Mill Plain Road. Stumps were ground on Liberty Street and at Tarrywile Park. The fence line at Stadley Rough School was cut and trimmed. The Forestry Division was pleased to partner with the Highway Division operating light towers for night milling activities.

## **Public Buildings Report submitted by Rick Palanzo, Superintendent**

**City Hall:** The city hall boiler project funds have been approved by the State (as we are using LoCIP funds) in early August. I retained a design team to design the redesign of the heating plant in the boiler room. The design proposal includes making one good steam boiler from the two that are currently in place; adding a new high efficiency hot water boiler for the north end of the building and the older perimeter loop and to remove the electric water heater and replace it with a high efficiency on demand water heater. This project was designed quickly and put to bid. The bids have been received and the contract will be awarded in early September, once the design team has had a chance to review the bids. Work will commence immediately on the existing steam boiler, to insure we have heat while the remainder of the project is completed.

**Farrington Woods Park – Westside Open Space:** Our next project at Farrington Woods will be to take care of the roof, siding and porch of the main house, as well as deteriorating roofs on some of the other residential buildings. This project will begin as soon as the LoCIP funding becomes available.

There is an artist interested in renting a portion of the Guest House at Farrington Woods for her studio. We will be investigating the possibility with the Mayor's office and Corporation Counsel. The lease agreement was sent to review by a subcommittee; however, the planning department has reported that an artist's studio is not a permitted use in this zone, so this proposal may be moot.

**Danbury Public Schools:** The transformer project at Danbury High School, which we intended to place on hold and rebid next summer, has been awarded to the low bidder. The low bidder agreed to hold his price until next summer, which will allow us sufficient time to request the funds required to complete this project in our next capital budget. This act will guarantee that this project will be completed before the students come back to school in August 2015. We appreciate the cooperation of the Purchasing, Corporation Counsel and Finance departments in helping to make this possible.

The three school buildings which required new roofs, Morris Street School, Great Plain School and the Educational Services Center began to be re roofed in July and work continued throughout the month of August. While the jobs are not totally complete, the roofing portion is complete and the school buildings are watertight. There will be some work to complete (metalwork) after school begins but it will not affect the teaching-learning process. The roofs should be finished by the end of September, weather permitting.

**Library:** We are negotiating with a prospective vendor to operate the café. The license agreement was referred to a subcommittee for review.

**Public Works Complex:** We have hired Kuegler Associates to design one emergency generation system for the entire Public Works Complex. This design work will take place over the autumn months and bidding will take place in the winter months with actual work to begin in the spring. This project will eliminate smaller stand-alone generators in favor of one large efficient generator that will supply the public works complex (upper level).

**General:** The Public Buildings team is working on these issues and projects:

1) The underground heating fuel storage tanks that we wrote about are being reviewed by professional engineers (TRC) to provide their engineering prowess in this endeavor. TRC is well into their design process and we will use above ground tanks wherever possible. The TRC site sketches have been reviewed and they are now finalizing the engineering. It is still our intent to bid the work in the winter for installation next July pending approval of the capital budget request.

2) We began school buildings maintenance and repairs as soon as summer recess began, and continued throughout August until the start of school.

**Requests for Maintenance Service:** Attached please find the statistical report of repairs and maintenance work that the Public Buildings Mechanics engaged in during the month of August 2014.

In the month of August we received 170 new work requests and completed 207 work requests. In reviewing this report, you will find the repair time that was expended in major work categories. Also listed is the total number of work order hours completed.

Public Building mechanics were engaged in general Plumbing repairs with a total of 371.50 person-hours dedicated to this service. The next largest area of concentration was in electrical repair work, utilizing 169.00 person-hours of labor. Maintenance repairs came in as the third highest category with 117.00 person-hours.
