The City of Danbury's Emergency Homeless Shelter has been notified that the City will be receiving a grant (either in a new grant or an increase in existing funding) of approximately \$6000.00 from the Department of Housing to be used for severe winter weather protocol along with the Governor's request for housing our homeless population during extreme winter conditions.

The funds will be used for salary of staff after shelter hours, transportation costs, hotel/motel stays for families with children and any extra supplies required by the shelter. The funds are to be used from December 15, 2014 through March 15, 2015.

The United Way will be dispensing the funds to all agencies participating and accepting funds from DOH. A signed contract will be needed to accept and utilize the funds as noted for the shelter.

There are no matching funds required for this grant. We request your approval to apply for, accept and use these funds in advance of receiving the grant paperwork in order to expedite the services required for our homeless population during our winter months.
