~AD HOC REPORT~
Government Entities - Code of Ordinance
Tuesday, February 10, 2015

Chairman Philip Curran called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. on Tuesday, February 10, 2015, in the Caucus Room, 3rd Floor, Danbury City Hall, 155 Deer Hill Avenue. Present were Committee members Paul Rotello, Alan Boyce, and Mark Chory, and Ex Officio Member Joe Cavo, Flood & Erosion Control Board. Also present was Becky Petro, Tarrywile Park Authority.

Mr. Curran noted there are 3 items on the agenda: Tarrywile Park Authority, the Flood and Erosion Control Board, and the Youth Commission.

Ms. Petro discussed Tarrywile status. She responded to questions regarding the Tarrywile Park Authority meetings and a vacancy on the Board.

A motion was made by Committee member Chory, and seconded by Councilman Rotello, to renew the Tarrywile Park Authority status for another 5 years. The motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Cavo asked that the Flood & Erosion Board be extended as a formality. He responded to questions regarding runoff and drains.

A motion was made by Councilman Rotello and seconded by Committee member Boyce, to renew the Flood & Erosion Board for another 5 years. The motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Curran suggested a two year extension of the Youth Commission, followed by a sun setting of the Committee, as the positions are not being filled.

A motion was made by Councilman Rotello and seconded by Committee member Boyce, to extend the Youth Commission for three years, with a note to Council that the heads of the parties explore getting more involvement in the Youth Commission. The motion passed unanimously.

Councilman Curran adjourned the Ad Hoc Committee meeting at 6:10 p.m.

ORDINANCE

CITY OF DANBURY, STATE OF CONNECTICUT

CITY COUNCIL

_____ A.D. 2015

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Danbury:

That Sec. 2-176 of the Code of Ordinances of Danbury, Connecticut, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2-176. Schedule of termination of government entities.

(a) The following governmental entities are terminated, effective June 30, 2016, unless reestablished in accordance with section 2-184:

- (1) The Danbury Parks and Recreation Commission.
- (2) The Aviation Commission.

(b) The following governmental entities are terminated, effective June 30, 2017, unless reestablished in accordance with section 2-184:

- (1) The Commission for Persons with Disabilities.
- (2) The Danbury Aquifer Protection Agency.
- (3) The Fair Rent Commission.
- (4) The Board of Ethics.
- (5) The Charles Ives Authority for the Performing Arts.

(c) The following governmental entities are terminated, effective June 30, 2018, unless reestablished in accordance with section 2-184:

- (1) The Stanley Lasker Richter Memorial Park Authority.
- (2) The Conservation Commission.
- (3) The Environmental Impact Commission.
- (4) The Danbury Museum and Historical Society Authority.
- (5) The Danbury Main Street Partnership.
- (6) The Still River Alliance Commission.
- (7) The Youth Commission.

(d) The following governmental entities are terminated, effective June 30, 2019, unless reestablished in accordance with section 2-184:

- (1) The City of Danbury Cultural Commission.
- (2) The Commission on Aging.
- (3) The Parking Authority of the City of Danbury.
- (4) The Danbury Housing Partnership.
- (5) The Lake Kenosia Commission.

(e) The following governmental entities are terminated, effective June 30, 2020, unless reestablished in accordance with section 2-184:

- (1) The Flood and Erosion Control Board of the City of Danbury.
- (2) The Tarrywile Park Authority.
