Subject: **Police Explorer Monthly Activity Report – November 2015**

During the month of November, as the holidays approached, we had the explorers continue and finish the **Danbury Youth Soccer** detail on Saturdays. The detail has worked the first two Saturdays during the month.

On November 12th, the explorers held a **First Night** open house event for prospective new explorers and their families to attend. The turnout was excellent and the Community Classroom was filled to capacity with standing room only. The program picked up approximately 18 new potential explorer cadets.

Beginning with November 19th's meeting, we began conducting our Eleventh **Basic Essential Skills Training (BEST)** for all new explorers who have come into the Post and have not completed 1 year of service or completed the Cadet Police Academy. For five consecutive Thursday evenings, the classroom is divided with the explorer recruits in one classroom attending the various training sections and specifically going over the Law Enforcement Explorer Manual. They also learned some very basic military style commands and movements, such as standing at attention and facing movements when marching. They were given a class on **RESPECT** which is part of our "total acceptance" approach to exploring. There will be an all day skills practicum, date to be determined in January, culminating with a graduation ceremony scheduled at police headquarters. This has become mandatory training for all new explorers in the Post and gives them a small sampling of what is required to be a Danbury Police Explorer. We have started out with 18 potential explorers.

Also, during this month on Wednesday, the 18th, P.O. Antedomenico, P.O. Cameron, and I attended the monthly **Cadet Police Academy Executive Board** meeting at the police academy. Discussion was on the upcoming 2016 Cadet Police Academy and the future of its expansion.

Sunday, November 22nd found 10 explorers (half of a full squad) assisting with the inaugural **Meatball Mile** road race at the Danbury Fair Mall sponsored by Mima's Meatballs. This not profit run was to raise awareness for MS.

On Thursday, 11/26, before the Thanksgiving dinners were served, approximately 17 explorers and several advisors worked the **Don Hassiak Memorial 5k run**, also called a Turkey Trot, at Tarrywile Park in the morning. The money raised from this event was given to Immaculate High School in memory of the late, P.O. Don Hassiak, an IHS alumni. The weather was very nice and there was a great turnout. This event has grown in size each year.

“Black Friday”, November 27th, brought the return of the **18th Annual Santa Wears Blue** holiday toy drive. Once again this year, the Danbury Police Explorers are holding their annual toy drive for the greater Danbury area. We will be collecting new, unwrapped toys for local abused and underprivileged children to open during the Holiday season. We are looking for your support for our toy drive. The toy drive began on Friday and run until Sunday, December 20th. All donated toys will be disbursed locally to the Danbury area that is serviced by the explorer program. New unwrapped toys may be dropped off at any of these locations in our toy drive boxes. The locations are: Danbury Police Department headquarters lobby, Danbury City Hall lobby, Danbury Public Works, and Sikorsky Financial Credit Union at 345 Main Street.

Santa Wears Blue Philosophy

All children deserve to smile on Christmas day. Christmas is one time during the year where the focus is on giving, with emphasis on the excitement in the child's eye as he or she unwraps a present that is just for them.

Why A Blue Santa?

It has been said, "No one calls 911 to tell police that all is well with their lives." In the course of a police officers' routine work we often encounter children in circumstances and environments that are heartbreaking. Many of the children that police interact with only know Christmas as nothing more than a school holiday. Many of these kids are in single parent homes or family environments that are unstable. Many families must choose between gifts and basic utility needs, leaving little resources for presents at Christmas time. Regardless of the whys, all children deserve presents at Christmas.

Who gets our help?

Danbury Police Explorers will recommend assistance to local families at Christmas as we meet these children in schools, recreation centers, parks, and neighborhoods throughout the year. Explorers may also receive recommendations from outside sources, such as youth service programs, churches, school counselors, and social workers, as well.

How you can help

We need new unwrapped toys or your tax deductible monetary assistance. It is the goal of the Santa Wears Blue toy drive to average two toys per child.

In conjunction with the 18th annual "Santa Wears Blue" toy drive for children who are victims of neglect and abuse in the Danbury area, the Danbury Police Explorers Post is conducting their annual "Stuff A Police Cruiser" at TOYS R US in the Danbury Square Mall located on Backus Ave. The event is scheduled to take place on Saturday, December 19th and Sunday, December 20th from 9 am to 5 pm. A police vehicle will be there to be stuffed with new unwrapped toys to be donated through the toy drive.
