My Dad passed away in June of this year.


My parents have been paying taxes for over 40 years and for these years have had to put up with living on a washed out dirt road with construction equipment parked on it. The land was originally owned and developed by Al Voytek Sr. After Mr. Voytek's death his son Albert 'Skip' Voytek built two additional homes on the road which he rents. After the second set of houses was built the road became much more prone to washing out and rutting. At times the road is impassable and vehicles have to drive up on the lawns of the rental homes to get to my parents house.

My Dad never wanted to rock the boat and he put up with this mess even though it often meant he couldn't get the road plowed and couldn't get out of the house.

My Mom has had to move out to be in an assisted living facility and we plan to sell or rent this house as a means of income to support her. Obviously the condition of the road greatly affects the marketability of this home and the other houses on it.

I would like to formally request a hearing to determine if the road can be paved and the property owners who border the road be assessed accordingly. I understand that once paved the road becomes the responsibility of the City of Danbury.
