

COMMUNITY SERVICES DIVISION

The following is a brief overview of the activities of members of the community Services Division for the time period of January 15, 2006 to February 15, 2006.

As you are aware the Community Policing Unit, better known as the Bicycle Patrol, is being reorganized. The five remaining officers assigned to this unit are being reassigned back to the Patrol Division as of March 13, 2006. To broaden the scope of this unit's function and to increase efficiency to meet the department and city's need, a Community Conditions Unit is being formed. Sergeant Scott Fabich has been chosen to supervise this unit and will be instrumental in choosing the six new officers which will be assigned to this unit. In addition to their newly assigned functions/duties, these officers will also patrol the downtown area on bicycles addressing the many issues.

Officer Mortara of the Community Affairs Unit along with Officer Carroccio of the Community Policing Unit checked 33 seats this month. There are seats for the Citizen Police Academy still available and the spring session is expected to start mid March to early April. Anyone interested in this program should contact Officer Mortara at 797.4644. In addition to this, the Community Services Division presented numerous crime prevention topics such as Child Seat Safety, Elderly Fraud Prevention, Identity Theft, Personal Safety/Street Smarts, and Scam Identification and Avoidance. They also participated in the Babies-R-Us safety Day event, & the DHS/City Hall Job Shadow Day.

Officers from the Community Services Division also organized an informational tour of the history and current condition of the Danbury Police Department Headquarters for Common Council members. This was done at the request of the chief of police in anticipation of the public hearing regarding the Bond proposal for a new Danbury Police Department Headquarters.

Officer Bobel continues his work with Fire Fighter Sniffen and Wade Anderson of Data Processing on our Mobile Data Browser upgrade. In addition to this, we are currently working on bringing online the new Cogent Live Scan AFIS fingerprinting system. This system was purchased under a Homeland Security funding opportunity. A projected rollout date has been set for May of '06.

Sgt Brunelli has been reassigned to the patrol division with his duties being divided up among different divisions. Sgt Al Russo now oversees the crossing guards, the records Division under Lt Charlie Kluge is doing alarm registry, Captain D Mulvey is coordinating Towing services, Professional Standards Unit is doing NCIC/Collect auditing while Fleet responsibilities fall upon Lt Gantert.

The Danbury Police Department's Police Activities League (PAL), Sgt Guerrero, executive director, reports that the facility is in full use & Danbury Hospital will be renting out the parking lot for employee parking.
