

PAL girls in-house basketball league is in full swing with 16 teams of girls ages 4 through 14 participating.

PAL girls softball is in the process of registering for the spring season, and will be holding several winter workouts pre-season in the gym.

The Explorers- Giants charity basketball game was held this month, along with a wrestling tournament and middle school dance.

PAL received a sizeable donation of tables and chairs from a corporation located in Dobbs Ferry New York. The company, Ekzo Nobel, is relocating in Brewster. Dale Steiken, an executive with the firm who lives in Danbury agreed to donate 150 chairs and 10 tables. The chairs new have a value of about \$90 per chair. There are other items of interest to PAL and we will be returning when their move to Brewster is almost complete.

PAL is, for the first time, sponsoring an AAU boys basketball program for the spring season. Presently we have four teams and are hoping to build this program up to at least eight age groups. This will help fill the gym during our non-peak seasons.

Also new to PAL will be a fitness program designed to promote good health, self esteem and many other benefits to children and their parents through Martial Arts. The program also has an adult/youth component linking mothers and daughters, fathers and sons, or, mix and match.

PAL raffle tickets are now available. This year PAL will raffle off 10 complete rounds of golf for a foursome, with carts, at ten area golf courses. Estimated value is over \$ 4,000, and the price of one ticket is \$ 20.00.
