
WHEREAS, the Program funds are available to any municipality who applies through a designated Regional Planning Organization or transit district; and

The enclosed documents detail the requirements for FY 2008 funding under the State's 13b-38bb municipal dial-a-ride program. The apportionments by municipality are unchanged from the current year.

Please be aware that several certifications may be required for the grant submission. All applications must include a maintenance of effort certification to be signed by your chief fiscal officer. Those municipalities that wish to apply through HART will need to complete a grant assignment certification as well. An authorizing resolution is required for the submission only if the signator on the FY 08 application differs from last year.

Discussion of the 13b program will be an agenda item at the February HVCEO meeting.



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
