Coordinator's Report

1. Clean up of past records.

HBechard asked how that is being done. The files are almost exclusively digital. All paper is scanned into a PDF and files are stored in the City "Google Docs" system and the Commission computer is backed up to the City IT shared server drive for common files and backups.

2. Last Meeting HBechard said Commissioners should think about allocation of funds in light of last year some groups didn't get their full season. How will the Commission prorate funding?
 - a. COORDINATORS OPINION: The Cultural Commission should focus on strengthening Cultural groups and help get them "back on their feet". This must be more than inserting dollars directly into the institutions. This must be about driving patrons into venues, growth through exposure.
 - b. A potential method could be a "Passport" of events. Patrons show that they have attended some number of Cultural Commission event and they receive a gift certificate for goods or services from participating city businesses or not-for-profits.

Old business

Brochure: The Coordinator asked where the physical brochure will be distributed. The Commissioners asked the coordinator to review how to turn the brochure into an on-line form like a virtual magazine.

New Business

Funding procedures in FY2020-2021 (see HBechard question)

HBechard: Commissioners should think about allocation of funds in light of last year some groups didn't get their full season. How will the Commission prorate funding?

A plan to change the ratio of funding to reduce offering sustaining grants to 45% of the budget and put 20% into growing audiences was discussed. Action is tabled until next meeting.

Action on Grant Requests:

1. Danbury Music Centre, Barbra Jaeger, Executive Director, requests \$25,000

The Music Centre is working on bringing musicians together in very small groups and with no in-person singing or wind instruments. As many as 10 on-line events as possible will be produced. A weekly Podcast is also in the works. A committee is exploring the technical issues expected to be encountered. The Executive director has been participating in D.R.E. a state sponsored program to bring arts organizations back in the COVID19 times.



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Commissioner GSmith asked how the Music Centre will capture an audience. BJaeger answered through their news letter and social media, such as Facebook "Boosts" advertising.

There will be no Nutcracker this year. Including all City funding, the Nutcracker turned a profit of \$13,000.

Action on Grant Requests: Danbury Music Centre, requests \$25,000. Moved by HBechard to grant \$10,000 seconded by CHill.

DISCUSSION: HBechard said her amount was derived by taking 65% of last year's grant. .

CALLED: The Motion passed for \$10,000.00 by unanimous vote.

Other Business

1. Commissioner JCherry asked who is funding the Marian Anderson mural. No Commissioner had direct knowledge. Chairman HCenter stated the Mayor had not contacted him about the project. Commissioner JCooke indicated that the Savings Bank of Danbury was involved in the funding and he will inquire for more information.
